Shelter animals are always in need

The range of issues facing the animals coming into our shelter is almost unbelievable at times. It is a rare animal that comes in that is "ideal," i.e., young, a popular breed, well-adjusted, gets along with other animals, is good with children, and only wants to sit in a comfortable lap and snuggle. Rather, cats are frequently covered in fleas, suffering from ear infections, sometimes have untreated fractures both fresh or old, are suffering from eye infections, are rife with parasites, are severely matted, and more often than not, terrified. Dogs don't fare much better. Dogs are also parasite infested, covered in fleas, sometimes have mange, and either cowering in fear or dangerous to handle. And those are the typical intakes. We also see way too many animals that are injured, sometimes severely, or so sick that in order to try to save them, we must get them to the emergency clinic immediately.

Animals like Rainbow, Iris, and Gabby.

Rainbow arrived on a frigid day in late November. This four month old little kitten was found huddled under someone's porch, trying to find warmth and safety. Thankfully, the people were able to get him in a carrier and to us. Because he

was so frightened, we gave him a quiet place to adjust. But because we always check our animals over as soon as it is safe to do so, we didn't waste time in looking him over. Our hearts sank...what was left of his little tail had been degloved all the way to the back of his spine. This can be a devastating injury...if the damage is too close to the spinal nerves it can cause permanent damage resulting in an inability to properly go to the bathroom.

Thankfully, upon a thorough examination, we discovered he did not suffer any permanent damage! But he would need surgery to repair his little stump. After surgery, little Rainbow didn't need much time before he realized he was safe and among friends. This little guy could be found zooming around our socializa-

tion room whenever our volunteers took him out. In fact, one prospective adopter passed on him because she thought he was too energetic! But it wasn't long before this endearing kitten found his forever home.

Because we are an open admissions shelter and turn no animal away no matter what the circumstances, that is how Iris ended up with us. This charming pot belly pig was surrendered to us when her owners saw how big she was getting. (Cont. on Page 8)

A Letter from the Executive Director—What's in a Number?

What's in a number? I have a long history with, and affinity for, numbers. In college and graduate school I studied mathematics and applied mathematics. In my career, my performance was measured against numbers (revenue, profit/loss, employee retention). Numbers can and should be important! However, like most things, there's a time and a place.

I find it's always important when throwing out a number to ask, "Why is it important that I know this?" In my career, for example, knowing profit/loss was important because I worked for a company that was a for-profit business. That made sense. Knowing the turnover rate in my Division was important because that's how we provided services to our customers. Likewise, there are numbers that are important in sheltering. For example, knowing how many animals we take in every year is important so we can properly allocate resources. Knowing how many vaccines we give every year is important so we can order the right supply.

We were recently asked, "What is your live release rate?" and "What is your euthanasia rate?" We are well aware that many shelters today are focused on their "live release rate" as an important metric by which they are evaluated. But one must ask...how does knowing that number influence animal care? I would argue that number is irrelevant as is knowing the euthanasia rate. Let me explain.

We value every single animal entering our doors and will decide how to care for that animal based on what's in its best interest and only that! Would we provide any more care for an animal if we thought it would help our numbers? Should we provide less care for an animal if our "live release rate" is already high? Should we ignore an animal's suffering if keeping it alive would help our numbers? An arbitrary number should NEVER be part of that equation.

If our goal is a 90% overall "live release rate," regardless of the individual circumstances involving that animal, then we are not valuing each animal as an individual. We would end up making decisions based on a number rather than caring with principle for each animal. Decisions on how to care for an animal entering our building would be secondary to how that decision influences our "live release rate."

Consider this example:

Shelter #1 is a "No-Kill," limited admissions shelter. They limit admissions to those animals they think are adoptable fairly easily. Shelter #2 in a (true) open admissions shelter that doesn't limit animals, doesn't require appointments, and doesn't charge surrender fees. They take in all animals that come to them. Let's say each shelter is similar in its

Shelter #2, because it accepts all animals in need and thus takes in a larger number of unhealthy, untreatable, injured, aggressive, diseased animals, has a "live release rate" of 63%. Both shelters placed ALL their healthy and treatable animals, but Shelter #1 has a

evaluation process for both health and behavior. At the end of the year, Shel-

ter #1 has a "live release rate" of 96% (remember, they took in only what

"save rate" of 96% and Shelter #2 has a "save rate" of 63%. Which is the "better" shelter? Which one is providing more services to the community and the animals dependent on them? It would be a no brainer for us. Clearly Shelter #2.

More meaningful numbers to know would be the answer to these questions: "How many people needing to surrender an animal did you turn away?" "What is the average wait time you tell people they have to wait to bring in an animal?" "How many people did you tell to just leave a vulnerable animal where you found it in "hopes" it will either find its way home or its mother will return or, as is more likely, it dies?"


To me, these numbers would tell me a lot about the quality of the shelter and whether its policies were humane or not. Though impossible to capture, the best number to know would be "How many people didn't even reach out to you with an animal because they saw your policy on appointments and surrender fees?" Or "How many animals got dumped or

in desperation, given away online to random people because you turned someone away?"

There is a time and a place for numbers. And policies have consequences. For a Humane Society or shelter, when its policies are numbers-driven those consequences will ensure decisions are based on those numbers rather than how best to alleviate animal suffering and how to do what's best for each individual animal.



We are incredibly fortunate to have the volunteer corps that we do. Our volunteers are fully integrated into the fabric of almost every facet of life at the shelter and beyond. Our volunteers contribute to everything from cleaning kennels, walking dogs, socializing cats, doing laundry, picking up donation money, helping with events, transporting injured animals or wildlife, and much, much more. Some volunteers are such staples of our efforts that operating without them is almost unimaginable. Bob and Mary Vethe are two such volunteers.

Bob and Mary started volunteering with us twelve years ago. In the course of volunteering for another cause (of course!) they were approached by our volunteer coordinator and struck up a conversation. Bob and Mary had already adopted a dog from us and had in the back of their minds that perhaps they would enjoy volunteering as well. It didn't take much for them to decide they could add the Humane Society to their long list of ways they give back.

Since that fateful afternoon, Bob and Mary have become an integral part of the shelter. They have taken on fun tasks like Pet-Assisted Therapy and the less glamorous, but no less important, tasks like transporting animals in need and monitoring our donation boxes. They can often be found representing the shelter at various booths around the area, including Sauk County Rural Safety Days, a two day event that hosts third graders from all over the county and teaches them safety tips on a wide variety of topics. They also represent us at



the annual presentation for the Reedsburg Area United Fund, which allocates grants to various community non-profits.

One of the most important ways they contribute is by running our very popular Critter Camp. As former teachers, this is a natural fit and an incredibly generous donation of their time. And this summer they will resume this effort after a long pandemic-related hiatus.

In addition to volunteering at the shelter, Bob and Mary help out with Fermentation Fest; do presentations and booths for Operation Migration, an organization that uses ultralight aircraft to teach migration to captive-raised birds such as endangered whooping cranes; volunteer at Reedsburg's Butterfest; help with the United Fund Radio Auction; serve on the board for the Reedsburg Alumni Association; conduct education classes for the Necedah National Wildlife Refuge; and handle info booths for the National Eagle Center at Wabesha, Minnesota.

Both Bob and Mary grew up with pets and have demonstrated a deep love for both dogs and cats, sharing their home with both throughout the years. Bob and Mary's commitment to putting their love to work by volunteering to help the homeless animals of Sauk County is a model of selflessness and giving. (Cont. from Page 1) Sadly, she had not been well taken care of...she had difficulty walking because her hooves were overgrown, she was dirty, and her skin had scabs and other issues. We don't take in pot belly pigs every day so our staff went to work researching what Iris would need during her stay. We discovered she was very sweet, sociable, and housebroken! She would need to go to home that would treat her as a pet and not as an outside farm animal nor a home with dogs, thereby eliminating many potential adopters. But the wait was worth it! Iris found her forever home with a gentleman with another pot belly pig. Iris is now living the grand life where she gets to sleep in a bed inside, has all the proper care she needs, and still gets to have outside time for rooting!

Sometimes an animal comes in that is so frightened, we aren't sure if we can ever help her. Gabby was one of those dogs. We don't know much about her history—her owner told

us their other dogs were ganging up on her and tormenting her. We could see she was traumatized. She refused to walk, trying to curl up as small as she could into

a tiny quivering ball. We had to carry her everywhere, even outside to go to the bathroom. She was so afraid of the world she defecated whenever anyone tried to gently touch her. We had our work cut out for us!

Knowing the noise and commotion in the dog kennel would be too much for Gabby, we gave her a safe space with staff in the front office. We spent hours and hours

on the floor with her, slowly stroking her and talking in low, calm voices. She would lie on the floor frozen in fear. But ever so slowly, Gabby started to realize the world wasn't such a


